
Our guest speaker will be Rev. Dr. Erin Bowers! Erin Kesterson Bowers is a North Carolina native. Born and raised in Raleigh, NC, she attended Duke University where she majored in English. After college, she spent five years working in urban ministry before attending Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, NJ. After finishing her M.Div., she stayed at Princeton to complete a Ph.D. in Theology. While there, she also met her husband of 11 years, Jay Bowers, a United Methodist Minister in Jamestown, NC. Together they have two daughters, Martha Glenn (8) and Helen (2). She is currently the associate pastor of First Presbyterian Church of High Point, NC.
